Did you know that they are made in 52- to 60-inch-wide goods? Yup, they are sold by the yard not dissimilar from fabric.




One type of Wall paper is grass cloth made from natural fibers. It is slightly wider. The double roll measures 36" W X 24'L.

Contemporary designs can feature geometric shapes, metallic finishes or texture but are generally used more sparingly. In bathrooms, vinyl-covered paper or vinyl is suggested. Why? It could withstand the moisture from the tub or shower.



Digital printing technology allows a homeowner to enlarge images and apply the finished product like any other wallpaper. When decorating in a space-starved room, some find thin wall coverings are efficient. It changes the feeling of any space without taking up much if any space. Papering a wall in a bedroom for those on a budget can be dramatic and economic.



Doing so is a dynamic and colorful way to highlight headboard bedroom walls. Photomurals are a bold decorative choice for modern rooms. Other ideas: Install wallpaper on the back wall of a shelving unit in an alcove for a cozy feeling and on the walls of the powder room. Make a strong design statement. Some find it's often less of a risk to
